

## *Letter from Langdon Street*

My dear people

During Easter Time the Church offers us stories in the Acts of the Apostles about how the Church began to grow, beginning with St Peter's first sermon on the Day of Pentecost. The Church grew in numbers and we hear how the First Christians went to the Temple each day to pray as a community, how they met in each others houses for "the breaking of bread" which we now call the mass. Today we hear about Peter not just in the Acts of the Apostles but also in the First Letter of Peter. Peter wants us to realise that just as God's people were led by Moses out of slavery to reach the Promised Land of Israel, so we as pilgrims are led by Jesus towards the Kingdom he has prepared for us. By his suffering and death and by the shedding of his blood, we have been redeemed from the slavery of sin and guided towards heaven.

A lot of things happened on the first Easter Sunday. First there was Our Lord's Resurrection. Then there was the story of the women finding the empty tomb, Mary Magdalen meeting Our Lord in the garden, the story of Peter and John running to the tomb, the appearance of Our Lord in the Upper Room and finally the story of the two disciples travelling to a village called Emmaus, which is the topic in today's Gospel.


St Luke tells us that one of the disciples was called Cleopas or Clopas. Our Lady had a step sister or half sister, also called Mary who stood at the foot of the cross with her, Mary Magdalen and St John. She is described as Mary the mother of Cleopas. There is also a

Marys in one household. We do not know the name of Cleopas' companion. We do know that as they made their journey to Emmaeus they were joined by a stranger.

Travellers were always glad if someone joined them on their journey. It provided extra help if they were attacked by robbers. The two disciples had heard so many stories that day and were trying to make sense of it all when the stranger joined them. He asked them what they were discussing and they were stopped in their tracks. The stranger must have been the only person in Jerusalem who had not heard of the death of Jesus. Jesus then gently explained the meaning of the Scriptures which all pointed to the death and resurrection of the Messiah.

When they approached Emmaeus, Our Lord gave the impression that he was going further. The disciples persuaded him to join them for supper. When they sat at a table in the dining room he blessed and broke the bread. They immediately recognised him but he disappeared from their sight. Even though Cleopas would have been a cousin or other relative of Jesus and must have been present at the Last Supper, he still did not recognise him until that moment. St Luke tells us that they immediately headed back for Jerusalem to tell their story to the apostles.

### **PRIESTS TRAINING FUND**

Next weekend we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday when we pray specially for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and the religious life. The annual collection to help the formation and training of future priests in the Diocese of Westminster also takes place. At present we have thirty nine candidates who are studying for the priesthood at our diocesan seminary of Allen Hall in Chelsea and at three seminaries in Rome and Valladolid in Spain. The Priests Training Fund, previously called the Westminster Ecclesiastical Education Fund (WEEF). On average it costs £25,000 per year to train a future priest with the full cost being £150,000. Priests are at the heart of the Catholic Church. Please be generous in your prayer and support. There is a donation envelope included with this week's newsletter and some prayer cards at the back of church. There will be a special collection at mass next Sunday, after Holy Communion. The fund also provides for priests undergoing specialist ministries, further education and ongoing enrichment to strengthen priests by means of sabbaticals and retreats.

### **CANON BERRY'S EMERALD JUBILEE**

On Wednesday 24 May Canon Berry will celebrate the 55<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his ordination to the Priesthood. You are invited to the ten o'clock mass on that date.
