Letter from Langdon Street


My dear people

Today is the fiftieth and last day of Eastertide. We call it the feast of Pentecost, a Greek word meaning fiftieth day. In Britain and Ireland it is also known as Whit Sunday. The vestments used today were originally white not red. There is mention of this in the early 13th-century poem called the *Ancrene Riwe*. Today is an important day in the history of the Church. In fact it marks the the beginning and first birthday of the Church. When Jesus took leave of the apostles he told them to go back to Jerusalem and wait for the Holy Spirit to come to them. Today's passage from the Acts of the Apostles describes what happened when the Holy Spirit came down upon them. As a result of Peter's first sermon three thousand people asked for baptism. From then on the Church began to grow and flourish. The apostles were still a fearful group of men until Pentecost. Most of them were uneducated fishermen and yet, after receiving the Spirit, the boldly preached about Our Lord as the Son of God and Saviour of the World. They received wisdom and knowledge. The Pharisees and leaders were amazed at the knowledge the apostles had acquired and the authority with which the spoke.

At the Last Supper, Jesus spoke of the Spirit as the Paraclete, the Friend who would stand by us. He also called the Spirit "the Spirit of Truth". The Biblical word that means "truth" also means "loyalty", and being loyal is an act of *love*. In the old marriage ceremony the bridegroom said to the bride: "I plight unto thee my troth." The bond of love that exists between a husband and wife is a gift of the Holy Spirit. This spreads to the growing community of the family. It also exists in the community of believers that is found in the parish family. St Augustine, one of the Fathers of the early Church, reminds us that a community is united by the things it loves, the

When we look at the civil society in which we find ourselves, we can see that in the lives of many people, we have ceased to be a true community of people who share the same values. It might still be possible to find genuine pockets of community here and there but these days many people lead very private if not lonely lives motivated by largely individualistic values. Jesus provides us with the model of a true human community. There was certainly much confusion in his own society in which Jewish values had to compete with Greek, Roman and other values. His response to this turbulent and often violent world was to bring to light the essential character of the God who had never forsaken his chosen people. He could only do this with conviction because he is the Son of that same God, literally One with the Father and the Spirit. Perhaps we can begin to understand why Pentecost was necessary and that is why the Church, at its best, *is* that perfect community for which all human beings long. Communities are united by their common values but a perfect community requires the presence of the Holy Spirit in each one of us, binding us together in perfect love. That perfect community is certainly to be found in heaven but even here on earth we can help to build it by communicating the merciful love of God to our own society and to the whole world.

DAY OF PRAYER FOR SYRIA

War and conflict in Syria has led to the deaths of hundreds of thousands since 2011 and the displacement of millions. Our bishops are encouraging the Catholic community in England and Wales to pray for Syria and its people on the Feast of St Ephrem - 9 June 2017. In his Easter Message Urbi et Orbi Pope Francis said: "May the Risen Lord sustain the efforts of all those actively engaged in bringing comfort and relief to the civil population in beloved Syria, so greatly suffering from a war that continues to sow horror and death." St Ephrem was a fourth century Syrian who suffered social injustice but, when Syria faced times of famine and conflict, he volunteered to distribute food fairly among the people and inspired them to unite for the common good.
