Dear Parishioners,

Generally, men are not very good at speaking about their emotions and feelings. Although thank goodness, this has started to change, the old notion of bottling everything up and carrying on did not help and certainly did not help me. After a conversation with a couple of parishioners, I have decided to say something about myself, which I know some of you may not particularly want to hear. For sometime now before I came to Tring I have been suffering with depression and I am telling you this in the hope that you will understand me a little more especially on the bad days. This subject has not been one to be discussed in the past, certainly not in the Parish newsletter. For all of us the Parish priest has been a figure not just of authority but someone who is there in our time of need, therefore he is seen as a strong character who shouldn't have problems of his own.

Up until recently the question of Mental Health was really a taboo subject, in my own family a great aunt who suffered with her nerves as a young woman went into a large mental health institution and stayed there till the day she died. This was a great failing of the society at the time. People with mental health issues were sent away and therefore out of sight out of mind.

Due to a better understanding of such issues the medical world and society have begun to change their attitude, but however, for a minority of people it is still a subject they do not want to hear about.

You may be asking yourself why Fr. Sean is telling us about such a private matter. It is in the hope you will understand that there are some days that even getting out of bed is a struggle, especially, as a Priest who is supposed to be always on top form. I would like to apologise for the occasions I have been late or seemed detached from the life of the Parish. Those of you who have had mental health issues will understand exactly what I am talking about. For a long time, I myself have pushed all this under the carpet and tried to carry on, and as the old saying goes "smile and wave that's what you're paid for".

Thankfully with the help and guidance of close friends I have taken the step and asked for help. I am away for 2 days on Monday 27th and Tuesday 28th seeking professional help. I hope this doesn't change my relationship with anyone and that you understand my reasoning for making this so public. I know that I have not thrown myself into the life of the parish properly. Although I was already suffering before I left London the move after 18 years in a community where I had close friends and a whole support network was much more difficult than I imagined. With the help that is now available I am hoping all this will change and I will be able to take the active part that I should have as Parish Priest. You have welcomed me with open arms and I truly thank you for your kindness, it takes time even years to establish friendships and relationships and I know this is already beginning to happen. I have always tended to bottle up my emotions and feelings but the time has come to try and be a bit more honest.

You are always in my prayers and I ask for yours, so that God may bringing healing and stability back into my life. God Bless You Fr. Sean.
