Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday are Lord reminds us how important Faith is, which is lived through our good works. This Gospel always reminds me of the ongoing disagreement with the Protestant Reform Churches who say that "we are saved by Faith alone". However, we in the Church believe that we are saved by Faith and Good works, our Devotional and Spiritual life being so important. This includes not just fulfilling our Sunday obligation attending Mass but also our private spiritual lives and each person expresses their love for God spiritually in different ways. It might be that you Pray the Divine Office, say the Rosary, spend time in Silent Prayer and Meditation, Devotion to the Saints, Novenas etc.

These wonderful spiritual aids which draw us closer into the Life of the Trinity must affect the way we live our lives and treat others. It's no good being seen Sunday after Sunday on our knees at Mass saying our prayers, when as soon as we leave the Church we open our mouths in vicious gossip. It never ceases to amaze me that some people think they are so close to God because they go to Mass on a Sunday, however, for the rest of the week destroy the character and reputation of their neighbour spreading malicious gossip even if it's true. This is not living by Faith and Good Works.

Our prayer life should help to transform our daily lives, it should help us to change our attitude towards people. The way we speak and treat others reflects our relationship with God. On that wonderful day when we stand before our Loving Father, I don't believe he is going to ask us how many times we went to Mass. (Which of course is essential for us Catholics), or how many Rosaries we have prayed. He will ask us; "did we lead lives of love", lives in which we were merciful and considerate towards others, thoughtful and charitable. People who not only prayed for the poor and the starving but did something about it. We believe that prayer and good works, love of God and love of our neighbour are inseparable and go hand in hand, each are vitality important, one reflects our love of God and the other reflects that we are all sons and daughters of God and brothers and sisters. Of course, we don't always live up to this law of love given to us by Christ and that is why in his wisdom and mercy he gave us the sacrament of Confession. God Bless, Fr. Sean
