#### Dear Parishioners

At the end of 10.30 Mass a week or so ago, I said to the congregation isn't it a joy having an organist, to which they showed their approval. I found the first year without an organist quite difficult as I enjoy listening to organ music and singing the Mass. Thursday night I popped into the Church during the Choir rehearsal and I was absolutely delighted that the Choir gallery was pretty full of singers and even more delighted that they were learning to sing the Proper of the Mass with the new modern mass setting. I thought how lucky we are to have Tom as our Organist and enthusiastic people joining the Choir. However, in order for this to continue we need to have a Music Fund. Churches are crying out for Organists who are few and far between, and I for one as I am sure many of you want to keep Tom as our Organist. Playing is not just something that Tom enjoys it is his bread and butter and so like other parishes he needs to be paid for his work. This means that we need to raise money for a Music Fund in the Parish.

I am pretty sure that a majority of the congregation enjoy listening to good music, the same standard of music should also be heard in our churches. During the late 60's, 70's and 80's Church music fell into an appalling state, totally disregarding the edicts of the Second Vatican Council many parishes pushed aside hundreds of years of church music. Gregorian Chant which the Council stated is the normal music of the Church and must be retained along with Polyphony were jettisoned and were replaced in my opinion with such banalities as Kumbaya.

Music which had raised people's minds, hearts and souls to God for centuries, was thrown out like the baby in the bath water.

Thank God there is now a change and appreciation of all that is beautiful, you only have to turn on the radio to such channels as Classic FM & Radio 3 to hear Gregorian Chants, Polyphony and Mass settings by many great Composers such as Mozart & Haydn. Good Church music is now being sung in our churches written by the likes of James Macmillan, Liturgical Music had a great boost as did all things Liturgical by the late Pope Benedict who inspired an increase in vocations to the Priesthood.

To be part of the proper process of renewal we need to learn new mass settings which aid us in our spiritual lives and for this we need an organist. This is a Parish of good singers and I was really inspired by how well people sang unaccompanied and I have noticed with the aid of an organist the congregation's enthusiasm for singing has increased. Without generous donations to this fund we will not be able to continue to pay our organist. I therefore propose a quarterly retiring collection to support this fund. If anyone has any ideas of how we can continue to raise money for this salary please do contact either me or the office. I for one would be heart broken if we took the backward step not to have an organist and I believe that many of you share this opinion.

Tom had no idea I was going to make this necessary appeal, I hope I have not embarrassed him.
