Dear Parishioners.

In the Gospel reading today our Blessed Lord tells the Samaritan Woman that he is the way to Eternal Life. That same offer is given to us and we can either accept it or reject it. We believe in the God of love and love is never forced on anyone it is a free gift that is offered to us every day of our lives.

How do we receive God's Love? Primarily we receive it in the Sacraments and the Sacraments that we would receive frequently are Confession and Holy Communion. God the Father understands our human nature and his son became man and was tempted in everyway that we are. Like any Father who always forgives his child God offers us forgiveness in the sacrament of confession. Why do so many Catholics not respond to God's offer and receive his forgiveness and healing in this most wonderful Sacrament.

To say that we do not need a priest to bring that healing and forgiveness into our lives is not Catholic teaching. Christ himself said "go and forgive sins in my name" and in another passage "those sins you forgive are forgiven". It takes humility and courage to do this, during the Lenten Season it is a great opportunity to return to this Sacrament. Never be afraid to reach out to Christ and ask forgiveness, the priest is a mediator between God and man and needs to go to the Sacraments himself.

Friday the 31st March Fr. Michael O'Boy the parish priest of St. Alban & St Stephen will be hearing confessions in the Church between 6.30 pm and 7.30 pm. This is an opportunity for those who find the thought of going to me for Confession to be daunting and terrifying. And the greatest means of Grace that the Lord offers us on this earth His very Self, contained in the most Holy Eucharist, His Body and Blood.

This is the Living Water he mentions in the Gospel to the Samaritan Woman, Food for our Souls and Food for the Journey. Our Lord gives us his Body as Food in Holy Communion and we have the privilege and opportunity to Worship His real Presence during Eucharistic Adoration when the Host is Exposed in the Monstrance for our Worship. Many times, in the Scriptures we are told how various people bow or knelt down to Worship Him, we too may do so as we Worship the same Christ mentioned in the Scriptures and Exposed for our Adoration.

Beginning next Saturday there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament each Saturday evening at 4.00 pm, I extend a special invitation to the extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to attend this Eucharist Devotion. You were chosen to bring Communion to the sick and then secondly to assist the Priest at Mass if numbers were so many it would take too long to distribute Communion. In your Ministry you are called to have particular devotion to the Eucharist for it is an extraordinary privilege to touch the Host and give Communion to the Sick and Housebound. Let us pray that all of us in the Parish of Corpus Christi will grow in Love, Reverence and Understanding of our Lords Real Presence
