First Reading: Acts2:14 22-33, Responsorial Psalm 15: 1-2,5,7.11, Second Reading 1 Peter 1:17-21 Gospel Luke 24: 13 -35 - They recognised him at the breaking of bread

#### Dear Parishioners,

Today's Gospel always gets my mind thinking of just how wonderful if must have been to sit and listen to Christ speaking. He captivated his friends who did not recognise him and he opened their minds to the Scriptures. They said to themselves "did not our hearts burn within us as he talked to us on the road and explained the Scriptures to us". I imagine that whenever he spoke even with great numbers of people listening you could have heard a pin drop.

Through his own study of the Scriptures, we are told that even from boyhood, the Scribes and Pharisees and Doctors of the Law would sit and listen to him with amazement at the depth of his knowledge. Christ came not to abolish the Jewish Scriptures but to fulfil them, all that the Prophets and Wise Men of the Old Testament had said about the Messiah had come true in Christ. Although we don't hear his voice we do hear his words when they are proclaimed at Mass or when we are reading the Scriptures in private devotion.

In order to hear the voice on what the Lord and understand what he saying to us today, we should all have the basis familiarity with Scriptures. It would perhaps be a good idea for all of us to have looked over the Scripture Readings before we come to Sunday Mass. I know myself in my own reading of the Scriptures that although I read the same passage time and time again I always gather something new and pertinent to life. Its amazing today, how many Catholic homes don't have a Bible which is the handbook of our Faith. Reading the Scriptures should be a regular part of our prayer life. Children should be exposed to the Scriptures at an early age. I remember being in awe as a child as I listened to the stories about battles, giants and miracles. Not dull boring stories but wonderful tales which all children love. Perhaps it's a good idea when we are attending a First Holy Communion or Confirmation of a family member or friend, a Bible might be an appropriate gift.

The Scriptures are the Living Word of God they have formed the foundations of European and many other societies around the world. They have helped us to become the people we are today as they guide us through our lives. Lets make sure the Sacred Scriptures are not just something we happened to hear proclaimed on a Sunday but a Treasury of the wonders of our Faith and the love that God has for all humanity.
