Dear Parishioners.

The month of June is dedicated by the Church to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and on Friday we celebrated the Solemnity of Our Lord's Sacred Heart. The symbol of the heart is so evocative and means many things to different people, but it primarily symbolises love. Images and statues depict Our Lord either with the heart on His chest as our beautiful statue in the Church does, or holding it in His hand.

When I look at the image of the Sacred Heart I am reminded of the depth of Christ's Love for us all and also the suffering that He went through to show His love for fallen humanity. His Heart is shown to us as a Flaming Heart shining with divine light, pierced by the lance-wound, encircled by the crown of thorns, surmounted by the Cross, and bleeding. The mystical Heart of Jesus has been revealed to us as an object of devotion. The use of Our Lord's Heart to symbolise the love for humanity is not found in the Scriptures but in the writings of the great mystics of the Church. It was a devotion fostered by Carthusian and Jesuit priests and prompted greatly by St. Francis De Sales. The devotion become especially popular throughout the world after the revelations given by our Lord to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, when He told her that a Feast should be established in honour of His Sacred Heart and for prayers of reparation for sins especially those against the Holy Eucharist. In 1856 the great Pope St Pius IX introduced the Feast into the general calendar of the Catholic Church. This beautiful imagery of the Heart of Jesus, which I am sure we all love, speaks to us primarily then of Our Lord's love for each one of us, a love so profound and so deep that he would take up the cross to die for us.

The whole month of June is given over in honour to our Lord's Sacred Heart, the Heart of Love, so why not in this month light a candle to his Image in our Church and thank Him for the gift of His love. If you wish to leave flowers to show your love for this devotion, please leave them by the Statue and we will place them in a vase.

This weekend I celebrate the Anniversary of my Ordination to the Priesthood, I find it hard to believe I am now 34 years Ordained. Might I ask that you say a special prayer for me. With the assurance of my prayers, Fr. Sean.
