Dear Parishioners,

The Gospel today, in which Christ explains the parable of the Sower, urges us to reflect on the depth of our own faith. I was reading about a Catholic country where there has been a massive decline in Mass attendances in the last decade or so; in that country there had been a considerable number of child abuse cases involving priests. This scandalized not only the inhabitants of that country but throughout the world. Understandably the discovery of such crimes over decades was shocking and traumatic. Probably as a result of this, a huge number of Mass-attending people have lapsed from the faith. Although each and everyone of us are rightly horrified by sex abuse scandals, should such crimes empty us of our faith? Understandably, family members where crimes were committed may never recover from the shock and our prayers and thoughts go out to them. But for thousands of people to stop practising their faith seems very sad. We cannot judge our faith through the actions of individuals, and if we do, and I am being the devil's advocate here, does it show that our faith has little depth?

A different scenario was the Pandemic and the large number of people who have not returned to the church on a Sunday. Admittedly there are a minority of those who are genuinely fearful of crowds during and after the Pandemic. For a larger percentage going to Mass was perhaps only a habit and not a reflection of Faith. If we believe in what the Eucharist truly is and understand our membership of the Church, the Body of Christ, we would never miss a Mass. Another reason why some lapse from the Faith is the death of a loved one; their grief is so desperately deep, and I understand that, that they wish to blame someone for their dreadful loss and God is the culprit.

Christ in the Gospel speaks about this "Depth of Faith"; in the Parable he tells where some people lose their Faith very easily because it has no root in them, or where the lure of riches chock the faith they have as material things are more important to them. Then of course there is the other group of people where their Faith lands in rich soil, because they hear the word of God, understand it and live it.

As from today there will be no newsletter until September. There will be a list of Mass times and Intentions at the back of the Church, on the noticeboard outside, and on-line. I would like to wish everyone a joyful and happy Summer Holiday and if you are travelling from Tring, a safe journey.
