


CORPUS CHRISTI, TRING

Síxth Sunday In Ordínary Tíme - pg. 137 ín the Parísh Mass Book



First Reading: Leviticus 13 1-3: 1-2, 44-46 - As long as the disease lasts he must be unclean; and therefore, he must live apart: he must live outside the camp.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 31: 1-2, 5-11 – You are my refuge, O Lord; you fill me with the joy of salvation.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians – 10:31-11 – Never take anything offensive to anyone – to Jews or Greeks or to the Church of God; just as I try to be helpful to everyone at all times, not anxious for my own advantage but for the advantage of everyone else, so that they may be saved. Take me for you model, as I take Christ.

Gospel: Mark 1: 40-45 – A leaper came to him and pleaded on his knees: 'If you want to' he said 'you can cure me'. Feeling sorry for him, Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him. 'Of course, I want to!' he said. 'Be cured!' And the leprosy left him at once and he was cured.
