THIS WEEKEND'S LITURGY

This weekend we come together to receive the Body and Blood of Christ, conscious of the fact that Jesus gave us his Body and Blood to sustain us and nourish us as we continue to carry out his mission. He is the living bread come down form heaven, the bread that is the flesh he gave for the life of the world, the bread that leads us all to eternal life. Let us give thanks to God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – for the unique and priceless gift of the Eucharist, to which we are invited every day.

In the desert, God sustains the Chosen People with a food -manna- they've never seen before. The Eucharist, however, is truly unique, for it is Christ's own Body and Blood. Paul points out that consuming it means that we participate in Christ's sacrifice. Jesus himself says it is essential to truly have life within you.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

In June 2011 Cardinal Nichols, our Archbishop wrote to all the Parishes in the Diocese concerning the manner in which we receive Holy Communion. In his letter he stated

"The usual practice in our Parishes is for the Sacred Host to be received on the hand, standing.

When receiving Holy Communion in the hand we make with our hands the form of both a cross and a throne in which we receive our King who sacrificed his life for us.

When we receive Holy Communion standing we show that we are ready to receive the Lord and to walk and act in his name. In standing we are part of a prayerful procession, a people with a mission, summoned by the Lord to the glory of heaven. This is our baptismal calling and dignity."
