THE THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

THIS WEEKEND'S LITURGY

Jesus in today's Gospel tells the parable of the three servants and how they dealt with the talents given to them. A talent was a large quantity of money, possibly a six-figure sum. Two of the servants use them to make more; the third buries his in the ground. The use of the word 'talent' to mean a gift or skill, originates from this parable, and this meaning is most appropriate for us today. As we continue our prayer together, we should reflect on the talents that we have been given and how we have used them in the service of God. These thoughts are appropriate on the Day of Prayer for the Poor, instituted by Pope Francis in 2016.

To whom would we entrust what is precious to us? In the first reading, a husband entrusts his heart and household to his wise and industrious wife. In the Gospel, the master entrusts his possessions to his good and faithful servants. The Lord has entrusted each of us with talents and duties.
