# CARITAS SOCIAL ACTION NETWORK

Caritas Social Action Network (CSAN) are working in partnership with St John of God Hospitaller Services to coordinate a Homes for Ukraine programme, which provides temporary housing and support for Ukrainian displaced individuals as they adjust to life in the UK. Their programme is dedicated to providing refuge for those fleeing the ongoing conflict in Ukraine and safeguarding the well-being of Ukrainians already residing in the UK. They have successfully matched 132 Ukrainian guests with generous hosts across the country since the programme's inception. Nevertheless, nearly two years since the full-scale invasion of Ukraine, the number of those still wishing to evacuate and find refuge in the UK remains high. In addition to matching hosts with guests, the project has expanded to assist Ukrainians in the UK to find private rented accommodation at the end of their hosting period. # **TOWARDS OCTOBER 2024**

Two dominant themes of the Synthesis Report from the First Session were Co-responsibility and Formation.

In preparation for the next session of the Synod, which will take place in Rome this coming October, we are being asked to consider how we, as a Parish, we might better organise ourselves for the mission of spreading the Good News of God's love for the world in our local area.

The second meeting will be today, Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> February, at 3.00pm in the Presbytery, to consider our response to the theme of Formation. This meeting is open to everyone.
