FR ANDREW WRITES:

The Last Things: Week Four

Advent is upon us once again, and a new year in the Church. We will be reading mostly from the Gospel of Mark at Sunday Mass for the next twelve months. The beginning of the year dovetails with the end, in that the first two weeks of Advent are not about Christmas, and Christ's First Coming as the Babe of Bethlehem, but about his Second Coming at the end of time. That's the *adventus*, the "coming" for which we prepare. For that we are told in the Gospel: Stay awake! To summarise our theme from the last weeks:

After we die our soul, the spiritual principal that endures after death, goes before God. In the **Particular Judgement**, our eternal destiny is decided: a life shared spiritually with God or not. **Heaven** describes that state of spiritual communion with God, and **Hell** the state of spiritual separation from God. Neither are physical places. Some, or many, of us will not be ready for spiritual communion with God. In that case we must go through a process of change which we call **Purgatory**, until we are perfectly self-giving and ready for heaven.

Paradise will then come when this world comes to an end, and is lifted up by God and remade. On that Last Day will be the **Resurrection of the Dead**, when we are made whole again, body and soul, ready to take our place in God's kingdom if we were chosen for it. On that day will be the **Final Judgement** in which the whole truth of ourselves will be laid bare.

None of this should frighten us. We should look forward to it! God bless, Fr Andrew.

Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1038: *The resurrection of all the dead, "of both the just and the unjust" (Acts 24:15), will precede the Last Judgment. This will be "the hour when all who are in the tombs will hear the Son of man's voice and come forth, those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of judgment" (John 5:28-29).*

1039: *In the presence of Christ, who is Truth itself, the truth of each man's relationship with God will be laid bare (Cf. John 12:49). The Last Judgment will reveal even to its furthest consequences the good each person has done or failed to do during his earthly life.*
