FR ANDREW WRITES:

The Sacred Paschal Triduum

This is Holy Week, the most important of the year. During Holy Week, the Church recalls the suffering and death of Jesus Christ and celebrates the startling revelation of his Resurrection from the dead.

The culmination of Holy Week is presented in three days of intense prayer and worship. These three celebrations are really a single liturgy encompassing the whole mystery at the heart of our faith:

- **The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper (Maundy Thursday, 7.30pm)** at which we commemorate the gift of the Blessed Eucharist, the means given to us by Christ of participating in his saving death on the Cross.
- **The Celebration of the Passion (Good Friday, 3.00pm)** at which we mourn the death of the Lord Jesus, but also celebrate it as the fulfilment of the Incarnation and the source of our salvation.
- **The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night (Holy Saturday, 8.00pm)** at which the Church remembers the joyous and startling revelation of Christ's resurrection from the dead and initiates new, adult Christians.

These three celebrations are referred to together as the *Sacred Paschal Triduum* and make the greatest sense when celebrated together.

Our preparations throughout Lent are not simply about self-improvement and detachment from sin and worldly addictions, but a preparation for worship, this great act of worship. I want to encourage you to join us to celebrate together our salvation.

Please note there is Mass at 10am on Easter Sunday, but no 6.30pm Mass.

If you are going away for the Easter holidays, I wish you and your families the blessings of this holy time. Please join in with the celebrations in the parish local to you.

Preparations for Easter – There is lots to do to prepare and decorate the church for Easter, and we need help next Saturday, 20th April, at 10.30am. With enough volunteers, it will take an hour at the most. Please come and help if you can.

Easter Offering – If you are going to be away over Easter, please consider making your Easter offering before you go. The offerings at Christmas and Easter make up Fr Andrew's salary for the year. There are Easter offering envelopes at the back of church, and these can be handed in with the collection or left at the Parish Office.

Silence after Palm Sunday Mass – One of the ways we mark the beginning of Holy Week is to finish the Palm Sunday Mass in silence. There will be no tea and coffee after Sunday morning Mass, and you are asked to respect the solemnity of this time by departing the church as quietly as possible after Mass.

Chrism Mass, Tuesday 16th April, 12noon in Westminster Cathedral – The priests of the diocese gather with Cardinal Nichols and the auxiliary bishops to bless the new holy oils to be used for the sacraments in the coming year, and renew their ordination promises. Everyone is welcome to attend.

The new planned giving envelopes are available this weekend. Please see the volunteers in the sacristy after Mass. If you would like to sign up for planned giving envelopes or a standing order for the parish, you can collect forms from the sacristy or they are available on the website. If you are a UK taxpayer and make a Gift Aid declaration, we can claim an extra 25p for every £1 you give, at no cost to you.
