WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY

This Sunday is the inaugural World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, instituted by Pope Francis. Addressing the elderly, he says:

The whole Church is close to you – to us – and cares about you, loves you and does not want to leave you alone!

He says that we should cherish the elderly and recognise that there's no retirement age from the work of proclaiming the Gospel and handing down traditions to grandchildren.

FR ANDREW WRITES:

At Sunday Mass for the next five weeks, aside from the Assumption on 15th August, we will hear chapter six of St John's Gospel, containing Christ's teaching about the Eucharist. The first readings will shed light on how God prepared the ancient Israelites for this incredible, spiritual food that Christ would one day give to us.

In the Eucharist, Christ feeds us with himself. His words are clear: he spoke truly, not symbolically, when he said: my flesh is real food, and my blood is real drink; he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life. The bread and wine, consecrated at Mass, truly becomes the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, his Real Presence.

This teaching can be difficult to grasp, just as it was for his disciples. It hinges on whom we believe Jesus to be. He is the incarnate Word of God, the author of creation.

Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1376. *The Council of Trent summarizes the Catholic faith by declaring: "Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly his body that he was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church of God, and this holy Council now declares again, that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. This change the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called transubstantiation."*

Future of the Artists Community – When St Patrick's Primary School closed in 2002, the Parish Priest at the time, Canon Digby Samuels, encouraged the formation of a community of Christian artists to evangelise the culture, using the classrooms as studio space. Nearly 20 years later, and with plans underway for the refurbishment of the Parish Centre, Fr Andrew has asked the artist community to consider its vision for the future, its objectives and how the parish might support it. The artists are looking for someone to help them with this process. No artistic expertise required, but some experience of leading group reflection and future planning, or similar, would be ideal. Please speak to Fr Andrew.

Sunday Obligation – Our archbishop, Vincent Cardinal Nichols, has confirmed that the obligation on Catholics to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended after 19th July. The bishops hope that it will be possible for all Catholics to return to Mass by the First Sunday of Advent 2021. In the meantime, they recognise that it is still not possible for all the faithful to attend on Sundays. That said, we must work to restore the Sunday Mass to its rightful centrality in our lives, and to rekindle in our hearts a yearning for the Real Presence of the Lord in the Eucharist. Please judge for yourselves. If you can attend Mass in person, and it is safe for you, you are encouraged to do so.
