I hope that making these preparations gives you peace of mind, too, especially as you reflect on the various passages from Scripture that the Church provides for funerals.

THE FUNERAL LITURGY

The funeral liturgy usually takes the form of the celebration of Mass, the highest form of prayer in which Christ's sacrifice on the Cross is made present. We offer the soul of the deceased in union with the Lord Jesus. In some circumstances it is suitable for the funeral liturgy to take the form of a Liturgy of the Word only.

The funeral liturgy usually takes place in the parish church, but it is possible to hold a Liturgy of the Word in the chapel of a cemetery or crematorium.
