FR ANDREW WRITES:

"Operation Elf"

Christmas can be a lonely and difficult time for children separated from parents. There is an additional stigma for those children with a parent in prison. These are three times more likely to struggle with mental health issues than other children. This year, through PACT (Prison Advice and Care Trust), we are partnering with HMP Belmarsh and have pledged to give 100 Christmas gifts for children who have a parent in prison. The children range in age from new-born to 16 years.

The presents will be distributed at a family fun day run by PACT in conjunction with the prison. This year, for the first time, parents will be involved in the wrapping of the gifts donated for their children. Our tags, handmade kindly by one of our parishioners, will assist with that.

Gift tags with gender and age are hanging on the tree at the back of church. Please take a tag and choose an appropriate present for that child. Please return your gift by **Sunday 26th November**, for distribution at prison family days before Christmas.

Gifts should be no more than £15 in value. Suggestions:

- Colouring books, toys, books, and creative playsets.
- Family board games.
- Baby gifts such as clothing, small soft toys, and winter accessories.
- Gift cards or vouchers for teenagers.

Unfortunately, due to prison security regulations, they cannot accept:

- Second hand or used items.
- Modelling clay or slime.
- Electronic or battery-operated toys.
- Anything edible.

Toy guns or weapons.

In addition, gifts must not be wrapped, as they will be inspected before entering the prison for security reasons. Gift bags or carrier bags are fine. You can leave your gifts in the sack in the sacristy, or drop them with Lucy or Jo in the Parish Office.

Getting Married? – Six months' notice is required for marriage. If you live in Wapping but are planning to marry elsewhere, even in your home country, you need to see Fr Andrew at least six months beforehand. This is very important!
