SEMINARIAN DEVON WRITES:

While Fr Andrew is away for his post-Christmas break, he asked me to write this week's newsletter highlighting formation for priesthood and vocations. Firstly, we need to understand what formation means; the goal of priestly formation is to form missionary disciples so that they are ready for consecration as shepherds for God's People, sharing in the authority of Christ the Redeemer, who sent the Apostles to preach and to heal. Furthermore, formation is, first and foremost, cooperation with the grace of God. Being called to serve the Lord and a community is unique for each individual because every person is called in different ways. Especially depending on the individual's preferences can influence whether the person hears the call and how they may derive this calling.

That being said, once a seminarian is accepted by the diocese and accepted to a seminary, formation begins quickly. There are four dimensions of formation that each seminarian must form throughout their studies. Firstly, **human formation**, in which the foundation is laid for the other dimensions. It is important as priests must remain human and close to Jesus' humanity. Secondly, **spiritual formation**, by which the seminarian learns to bring everything from the other dimensions into his relationship with Jesus Christ. Therefore, creating a stronger relationship with Jesus. Thirdly, **intellectual formation** allows the seminarian to have a deeper understanding of the truths of faith and the human person, enriching his relationship with God. Thus understanding of himself, and his service to others, allowing himself to have a deep understanding of human and divine wisdom by studying the Word made flesh. Finally, in **pastoral formation**, the seminarian learns how to express the other three dimensions in pastoral charity, the overall goal of priestly formation. More so allowing emulation of the Lord Jesus Christ as the Good Shepherd and serving others.

However, as Pope Francis says "each one of us is called – whether to the lay life in marriage, to the priestly life in the ordained ministry, or to a life of special consecration; in order to become a witness of the Lord, here and now". As Jesus always did what was pleasing to the Father, and always living in perfect communion with him. Likewise, as his disciples, we are invited to live in the sight of the Father in order to become perfect like our heavenly Father. Thus, following Christ and united with him, we can strive to be imitators of God as beloved children and walk in love by conforming our thoughts, words and actions, which is in Jesus Christ. The Eucharist is at the centre to this calling, whether we are called to priesthood or vocations, and it represents Christ's gift of himself to us. Therefore, through the imitation of the Lords love and primacy of grace we conform our minds and hearts to the Lord, as we follow his example. In essence, we are invited to participate in a life of intimacy, an opportunity to partake in the being and life of God.
