FR ANDREW WRITES:

Towards the Synod of Bishops 2024

The Synod of Bishops met in October 2023 on the subject of "synodality" itself ("journeying together"), with a further meeting scheduled for October 2024.

The Church is a communion of the People of God. It is the nature of the Church that all her members journey together and take an active part in her mission to evangelise the world. The synod intends a renewal of the Church's mission and our shared responsibility for it. What emerged, last year, was a focus on building up communion and widening participation.

For our diocese to contribute to the next stage of the synod, our archbishop, Cardinal Nichols, asks parishes to meet and to reflect on a few simple questions about how our own parish is living out the Church's mission. I propose that we do that on **Sunday 18**th **February, 11.15am**, after the morning Mass. We will arrange refreshments in the parish centre. Please do come and contribute.

On Suffering

One of the most common objections raised against people of faith concerns human suffering. Why would an all-knowing, all-powerful, and all-good God allow us to suffer? The first reading at Mass this weekend is taken from the Book of Job, in the Old Testament. Job is the most profound exploration of this difficult question in the Scriptures.

These few words are insufficient for an adequate answer to that question, if there is an adequate answer in the face of the lived reality. However, if you have wondered about this, and want to explore it further, then I commend to you an apostolic letter of Saint John Paul II called "Salvifici Doloris" ("salvific suffering"), written in 1984:

The Catechism of the Catholic Church addresses the question of evil and sin in paragraphs 385-421 (and therefore the origin of suffering), and the question of illness and suffering in paragraphs 1499-1513:

Perhaps most importantly, for now, we recognise in the Cross of Jesus that we are not alone in suffering. God allows us to suffer, but not uninterestedly, observing from afar. Rather, he enters the world in Jesus Christ and experiences the mystery of human suffering for himself. Moreso, he embraces all the evil and suffering of the world, so

that we are never alone when we suffer, he is there. And he uses that suffering and death, on the Cross, as the very means of our salvation, forever changing the meaning of suffering and death for the Christian. This is an awesome and difficult mystery.

Next Sunday, 11th February, is the World Day of Prayer for the Sick. It would be the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, were it not Sunday. Perhaps this week we might turn our prayers particularly to the sick and suffering, especially in our own parish and among our loved ones.
