THE HOLY FATHER'S PRAYER INTENTION

February: For the Terminally III. Let us pray that the sick who are in the final stages of life, and their families, receive the necessary medical and human care and accompaniment.

March: For the Martyrs of Our Day, Witnesses to Christ. Let us pray that those who risk their lives for the Gospel in various parts of the world might imbue the Church with their courage and missionary drive.

FR ANDREW WRITES:

One important part of our individual preparation in Lent is to make Confession. I will be available on the Fridays in Lent, after Stations of the Cross, 7.30-8.00pm, 1st and 8th March, and any Saturday or Sunday 6pm. You can also ask me after Mass any day, or contact me to arrange another time. Please don't worry if it's been a long time.

First, it is important to prepare by making an Examination of Conscience. A simple version is on the parish website: https://parish.rcdow.org.uk/wapping/confession/

Then, this is a reminder of the rite itself:

In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Bless me, father, for I have sinned. It has been (how long?) since my last Confession. I am single/married. These are my sins...

Name your sins clearly and briefly. When you are finished, indicate to the priest by the following or similar: For these and all my sins I am truly sorry.

Listen to the counsel the priest gives. He will give you a penance to perform later. Next, he will ask you to make an "Act of Contrition" (this is one version):

O my God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you, whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with the help of your grace, to do penance, to sin no more and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Saviour, Jesus Christ, suffered and died for us. In His Name, O Lord, have mercy.

The priest will say the prayer of absolution. At the words "I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father..." make the sign of the Cross. Then the priest will dismiss you with a short prayer. The response is: **Thanks be to God.**

If your Lent has not begun as well as you had hoped, don't worry! There are still four weeks to go. May the Lord bless each of you in this week ahead, Fr Andrew.
