FR ANDREW WRITES:

Laetare Sunday (and Mothering Sunday)

This Fourth Sunday of Lent takes its name from the Latin of the entrance antiphon for Mass: Rejoice, O Jerusalem! "*Lætare, Ierusalem*". We have just passed the midpoint of Lent, and this is marked by a relaxation of the penitential character of the Lenten season. In church, just for a day, flowers may be used for decoration, the organ may be played more fully, and the usual Lenten purple is replaced with rose pink.

Outside of church, there is a relaxation of the usual Lenten fasting. In England, a Medieval tradition anticipated Easter with simnel cake, a light fruitcake with layers of marzipan and eleven marzipan balls for the eleven apostles (no Judas Iscariot!).

Also connected with Laetare Sunday in the British Isles is Mothering Sunday. From the Middle Ages, this Sunday you would visit your "mother church", meaning the church in which you were baptised and raised, and visit family at home and celebrate. Our modern Mothering Sunday celebration comes from this tradition.

We give thanks to God today and ask his blessing on our mothers, and on those who have taken on the role of mother in our lives. But this is also a difficult day for some. We hold before the Lord the souls of our mothers who have died, and we ask his blessing on those who have a painful and unfulfilled longing to be mothers.

Selection Advisory Conference

This coming weekend is the annual Selection Advisory Conference at Allen Hall Seminary. It's the penultimate step for those applying this year to enter seminary and begin formation for the priesthood. Candidates are interviewed by a panel comprised of priests and lay men and women, drawn from across the diocese, who make recommendations to the Cardinal. Please pray for the Holy Spirit to guide the candidates and selectors. I am responsible for this process, as Vocations Director, and shall be away next weekend. My thanks to Frs Irvin and Crescent for supplying.
