FR ANDREW WRITES:

Easter Blessings

Easter is the "feast of feasts". St Athanasius called it the "Great Sunday". The celebration of Easter is connected to Baptism. Please pray for Joshua and Santiago, baptised at the Easter Vigil, and for all new members of the Church this Easter.

So many parishioners have worked hard so our celebrations of the Sacred Paschal Triduum and Easter have the solemnity they deserve. It has been a family effort! The purpose was to glorify our Risen Lord, but I still want to express my thanks to everyone involved. I am sure you will agree that the church looks beautiful for Easter, and our celebrations of Holy Week were dignified and uplifting. Thank you all.

Thank you, too, for your generous cards, gifts, and Easter offerings for me. The offerings at Easter and Christmas are the main source of the stipend I receive as a priest, so your generosity at this time is much appreciated.

The season of Easter lasts now for fifty days: forty days to the Ascension of the Lord (Thursday 9th May) and then another ten to the celebration of Pentecost. Eastertide is deliberately longer than Lent; the celebrations are longer than the fast!

Divine Mercy Holy Hour – Next Sunday 2.30pm

Next Sunday is "Divine Mercy Sunday". The Divine Mercy is a devotion celebrating God's infinite love for us all. It originates in revelations received by St Faustina Kowalska, the "Apostle of the Divine Mercy", in Poland in the 1930s, and commended to the whole Church by Pope Saint John Paul II.

We will have a Holy Hour at 2.30pm, with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, the Divine Mercy devotions at 3pm, and concluding with Benediction at 3.30pm. Confession, which is the sacramental encounter with the Divine Mercy, will be available throughout. Whether or not you are familiar with the Divine Mercy devotions, you are very welcome.
