FR ANDREW WRITES:

The Paschal Candle

The Paschal Candle, currently standing in the sanctuary by the ambo, is the Easter symbol of Christ. It was lit from the new fire at the Easter Vigil last Saturday night: the fire being a symbol of the new light of the Resurrection dispelling the darkness of Christ's death. The candle is decorated with a Cross and the current year, and the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, a reference to Christ's words in the Book of Revelation:

"I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end." (Revelation 22:13)

Into the Paschal candle was inserted five brass pins containing beads of incense. These are a reminder of the spices with which the body of Jesus was wrapped for burial, and represent his five precious wounds: the three nails in his hands and feet, his pierced side, and the crown of thorns. In the past the incense would be buried in the candle, so that it caught and released fragrance as the candle burned down.

The design of the candle this year is based on the doom paintings found above the chancel arch in Medieval churches. These paintings depicted the Risen Christ, displaying his wounds, and sitting in judgement: the angels and the elect on his right, the

demons and the damned on his left. He has an orb under his feet, signifying his dominion over the universe, and he is seated on a rainbow, a reference to the Lord God Almighty in the Book of Revelation:

"And he who sat there appeared like jasper and carnelian, and round the throne was a rainbow that looked like an emerald." (Revelation 4:3)

The Paschal candle remains in the sanctuary for the season of Easter (until Pentecost), and then is used at baptisms and funerals throughout the year.

Feel free to have a closer look. It was designed and beautifully painted by Bernard Allen, one of the community of artists in the Parish Centre. I am very grateful to him indeed. You can see more of his work here: www.bernardallenart.com.
