FR ANDREW WRITES:

'Dignitas Infinita' - Declaration on Human Dignity

The Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, acting under the authority of Pope Francis, published a declaration on Monday about human dignity. Our Catholic emphasis on human dignity begins with the fact that human beings are made in the image and likeness of God, and was further elevated when the Word of God united human nature to himself in the Incarnation as Jesus Christ.

Human dignity is described in terms of:

- Ontological dignity, which belongs to a person simply because he or she exists and is willed, created, and loved by God.
- Moral dignity, which is about how a person exercises their freedom.
- Social dignity, including the quality of a person's living conditions.
- Existential dignity, including how a person understands their life to be "dignified" or "undignified" given the experience of illness, violence, addiction.

The latter three can be compromised or challenged, whereas a person's ontological dignity is "indelible and remains valid beyond any circumstances in which the person may find themselves." It is ontological dignity that should be the foundational basis for human rights, with the right to life most fundamental of all.

The declaration comments on several moral issues related to human dignity: poverty, war, migrants and trafficked persons, sexual abuse, violence against women, abortion, surrogacy, euthanasia, marginalisation of disabled persons, gender theory and sex change, the death penalty, and digital violence. It's a substantial document.
