THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

19 November 2023

Our Planned Giving Drive has begun We are a great parish. Holy Mass, the Eucharist, prayer and devotion, at the heart. This is what Church and mission is about. We are not a club or a day centre. We are here today, thanks to the generosity of those who went before us. We recall the generosity of Stephen Taprell Holland who paid for the church. We owe so much to him and all who have supported this parish over the years. So, we ask - What legacy will we be handing on to those who will follow us? What is our vision, hopes or dreams for Holy Rood? Ideally, to keep this church and parish open and up and running. Churches have closed in the diocese and across the country. In the next few years more churches may close or be clustered with another church or 2. Sadly 2 priests have recently died, which means two parishes in Borehamwood and one in West London have no priest at the moment. A priest from Hemel is ill and won't be able to return to active ministry. This is a snapshot of the situation across the country. We must not get complacent and presume this church will always be open. Please God it will be, but most likely it will be clustered with another. This will impact on what we can and cannot do. Part of our vision should be to continue to keep this church open every day. We hear about the importance of outreach, churches working together and Ecumenical measures. Well, we do this every day, simply by opening the doors to anyone who wants to come in for a prayer, to light a candle, to sit in silence or quietly shelter from the cold. Many will remember the pain when the churches were closed during lockdown. As priests, we are asked to catechise our parishioners in sacramental preparation, to baptise, to marry couples, to celebrate funerals and to bury the dead of our loved ones. We also counsel and support many who come to the door; broken, in pain, carrying heavy burdens. They come because they see

the church as a safe place, or a final resort. One homeless guy liked to sleep on the presbytery door step because he felt safe being next to the church. In the offices, we are expected to run a business. So much administration, governance, legislation, financial accountability, health & safety, building issues, policies and procedures. This list goes on. All of the above doesn't just happen. It has to be resourced; priests, staff, finance, volunteers. As a parish, we already have a culture of joyful giving but it is important that we regularly evaluate. We do not receive funding from state, Vatican or diocese. We are reliant on our offertory collections to cover all running costs. 33% of our offertory collection and any rent goes to Central Services at Westminster. Let us focus on our vision. Why are we here? Why do we come to church? Do we want to be part of this parish in the future? Do we want this parish and church to remain open and functional in the future? Is a parish church really necessary? A Planned Giving Drive is a chance to learn about parish finances, and a better way of giving; Gift Aid and Standing Orders. It is an invitation to all to reflect and renew their commitment of time, talents and treasure to the parish. Please consider the following: How is God calling me to use the blessings and gifts He has entrusted to me? Am I using my gifts of time, talent and financial blessings responsibly? How can I use them to support my parish? As you entered Mass today you will have been handed a newsletter titled 'Our Parish, Our Responsibility.' Please take home and read carefully and prayerfully. Thank you for all that you do for this parish. These are difficult financial times. But life is always financially challenging. The most important thing at this moment is not to worry or feel pressured. God will guide each one of us in the right direction. What we can't do, is nothing.
