Second Sunday of Advent

All of history has been preparing for the coming of the Messiah. After the fall of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden, the children of God have been awaiting a Saviour. The prophets and kings of Israel foretold His coming. The chosen people of God prayed for Him in the hardships of oppression and the captivity in Babylon. God's Anointed One would come to free them from the bonds of slavery.

While the priest Zechariah served in the Lord's temple, the angel Gabriel appeared to him and said:

"Do not be afraid Zechariah, because your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall name him John. And, you will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He will be filled with the Holy Spirit even from his mother's womb, and he will turn many of the children of Israel to the Lord their God. He will go before him in the spirit and power of Elijah to turn the hearts of fathers toward their children and the disobedient to the understanding of the righteous, to prepare a people fit for the Lord."

Thus, John the Baptist was the last and greatest of all the prophets and our redemption was now at hand. Six months later, the angel Gabriel appeared to Mary, in the town of Nazareth and announced she would be the Mother of God; that she would conceive by the power of the Holy Spirit and carry within her the Word of God. Gabriel told her that her cousin Elizabeth was also having a baby. Upon her arrival to Elizabeth's house, John leaped in his mother's womb when he sensed the presence of the Messiah within

Deacon Neville - 01923 224085 (Opt 2) ALL BOOKINGS VIA PARISH OFFICE Catechism Corner When one receives Holy Communion standing, one is asked to make a specific act of adoration before receiving the Sacred Host, a simple bow of the head. While waiting for the person in front of you to receive, recollect yourself for a moment. If receiving the Sacred Host on the tongue, after saying Amen" (not thank you) the communicant should open the mouth wide and extend the tongue far enough so that the Sacred Host may be placed upon it without danger of falling. Please note that it is important to extend the tongue, not just open the mouth. Another option is receiving in the hand. Approach the minister, extend the hands in the middle of the chest. A throne is formed to receive the Sacred Host. The response of "Amen" is given to the proclamation "The Body of Christ," and the Host is received. The individual should then step to the side and receive the Sacred Host carefully and reverently. If unable to receive the host on the hand safely and respectfully, please receive on the tongue. It is wrong to consume the Host walking away. Remember "Who" you are receiving. It is very important that all understand that one does not have the right to receive Holy Communion as one pleases. One may only receive in the manner dictated by Church Law. Only those practicing Catholics who are in the state of grace may receive Holy Communion. Those who are not in the state of grace must first be reconciled to God and the Church by means of the Sacrament of Confession before presenting themselves for Holy Communion.
