First Sunday of Advent

3 December 2023

Advent begins this weekend and is from the Latin 'advenire', which means "to come toward, a season of arrival, as we come nearer to Christ in our hearts. A season in which we refocus our lives, seeing how we can best work with God's plan for our salvation. A season in the Church's life intended to renew the experience of waiting, and longing, for the Messiah. Though Christ has already come into the world, the Church invites us to renew our desire and open the door of our life to the Lord. Advent is an expectant, waiting, hopeful preparation for that second coming of the Lord. How do we prepare in Advent? "Be on your guard. Stay awake. Because you never know when the time will come," Jesus tells us in our gospel. We need to recognise that the Lord will arrive or that our earthly lives might end suddenly. Do we accept that reality, or do we walk around in a dream, thinking that judgement is just a vague distant reality? When we are awake and ready, all the temptations of the world become far less appealing. We live lives worthy of our calling as sons and daughters of God. Yes, Advent is a time to be alert. To live in a manner worthy of our calling. But it is also a time for preparation, a time to grow in knowledge of the Lord and his love for us, as we approach the beauty of the Incarnation. We can do this in different ways, in coming to Mass, adoration or confession on a Friday evening, attending Journeying with the Gospels on a Tuesday or one of the extra 7.15am Masses on Fridays. In our homes, making our own Advent wreath or cards, blessing our tree with holy water (with the lights off!) or by spiritual reading. What matters most is to do something.... something that wakes us up to the incredible event that we will celebrate

on 25 December and which makes us more prepared to celebrate full of faith, hope and love.

If you missed out on completing a form, there are plenty left. Please complete before you leave today and hand back to the priest. It is important that everyone completes a new form.
