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First Sunday in Lent

18 February 2024

Begin Again The liturgical use of ashes originates in the Old Testament. Ashes symbolised mourning, humility and penance. Job repented in sackcloth and ashes; the prophet Daniel turned back to the Lord, by earnest prayer, fasting and sitting in ashes and Jonah after preaching repentance to the Ninevites, the king covered himself with sackcloth and sat in ashes and the populace were spared of God's wrath.

Jesus also made reference to ashes. In reference to the towns that refused to repent of sin although they had witnessed miracles and heard the good news, our Lord said, "If the miracles worked in you had taken place in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago in sackcloth and ashes".

Over time, the use of ashes was adapted to mark the beginning of Lent and the ritual is found in the earliest editions of the Gregorian Sacramentary, which dates back to at least the eighth century.

Around the year 1000 AD, an Anglo-Saxon priest named Aelfric preached: "We read in the books, both in the Old Law and in the New, that the men who repented of their sins bestrewed themselves with ashes and clothed their bodies with sackcloth. Now let us do this at the beginning of our Lent that we strew ashes upon our heads to signify that we ought to repent of our sins during the Lenten fast."

In our present liturgy, ashes are made from the palms of the previous year. The priest blesses them and imposes them on our foreheads, making the sign of the cross, saying, "Remember, that you are dust and to dust you shall return," or "Repent and believe in the Gospel"

As we begin this holy season of Lent to prepare ourselves for Easter, let us keep in mind the significance of the ashes we have received, so that we may be ready to receive Him who suffered, died and rose for our salvation.

"Yet even now," says the Lord, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments". Return to the Lord, your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and repents of evil. (Joel 2:12-13)

What a blessed start to Lent Great attendance at our 3 Masses, with St Anthony's School joining us for the 12noon Mass, a school Mass at Holy Rood, pastoral visits to people at home and care home visits. We all have another chance of renewal and by Easter we need to have changed and be better Christians. Let us take up some of the extra Lenten works. An extra 7.15am Mass on Fridays for those going to work or school. Stations of the Cross at 12.30pm and 6.30pm on Fridays. Sacrament of Confession, Fridays at 6.30pm and Saturdays at 11am. (A visiting priest will join us on Friday22 March.) And our Lenten Almsgiving project this year split between New Hope and the Holy Land. God bless you all.

Catechism Corner A recent survey in the United States revealed that 70% of Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. They saw it merely as symbolic. If that survey were to be repeated in the UK, would it find a similar proportion of Catholics who would report the same? The Real Presence is what we will reflect on in Lent. Let us recall how we should be receiving Holy Communion at Mass. When we approach to receive Holy Communion, the Priest or Minister holds up the Sacred Host in front of you and says "Body of Christ". You respond by saying "Amen". The Sacred Host is then placed on your tongue or in your hand. If you receive the Sacred Host in your hand, place the Sacred Host in your mouth before moving away from the Priest or Minister. Under no circumstances should you carry the Sacred Host away from the Sanctuary in your hand. If you ask yourself now, do you believe the Eucharist is the true body of Christ or just symbolic.? If the latter, we have a lot of work to do. *To be continued*....
