Funeral and Social action project grants

MATRIMONY

If possible, the celebration of the sacrament of matrimony should be deferred until such time that people can gather in numbers safely.

FUNERALS

There should be great pastoral sensitivity to this issue. The funeral service should take place at the graveside or at a crematorium, subject to the conditions laid down by the cemetery or crematorium authorities. Arrangements should be made for a Mass to be celebrated in memoriam when congregations are allowed to gather.
