

THE GOD WHO SPEAKS – SUNDAY MEDITATIONS

Meditate: The passion of Jesus speaks about each one of us and invites us to identify with the characters. As this time of uncertainty we do well to reflect what role we play in this drama of our salvation. Who are we in this story? Are we the disciples who run away? Are we the crowds who betrayed Jesus? Or perhaps Simon, Joseph or the women who follow and assisted him? All of us have a role to play.

Act: Lord Jesus out of love for humanity you mounted the wood of the cross while all along praying for those who assisted your execution. Give me courage to place myself in this story and strength to stand by you.

Street Homeless

Funeral and Social action project grants

Caritas Westminster offers crisis, funeral and social action project grants through the St John Southworth Fund. These will continue to run as normal but we have also created a new grant for any project in urgent need of funds to respond to the pandemic. This '**COVID-19 Emergency Project Grant**' offers projects £500 to spend on any immediate needs such as adapting their service or buying emergency food. Few information from the Council of Brent

- ◆ **Foodbanks:** Brent Council and the Brent Food Aid Network are working together to deliver foodbank services. Residents who need food parcels should be referred to Brent Council by **calling 0202 8937 6792**. Anyone can make a referral. Callers will be taken through a simple assessment; the details provided will be relayed to a Central Hub and Distribution Centre, located at Bridge Park where the foodbank service will be provided. Anyone wanting to donate to Brent foodbanks should also call **020 8937 6792**.
- ◆ **Isolation support:** There are local Brent community groups who can help people needing things like food or medicine to be delivered to them during the current lockdown. For more information call **020 3011 1690**.

Emergency support available:

- * **Adult Social Care:** If you or someone you know needs urgent help washing, feeding or dressing themselves but does not have any friends or family to support them, call **020 8937 6589**
- * **Children at Risk:** If you have any concerns about a child being harmed or at risk of harm, call Brent Family Front Door, on **020 8937 4300**.
- * **Domestic Abuse:** If you or someone you know is affected by domestic abuse, speak to Advance by calling **07398 454898** In an emergency, always call **999**.
- * **Emergency Childcare:** For emergency childcare (for vulnerable children or children of key workers), call **020 8937 3010**.
- * **Housing:** If you are homeless, or threatened with homelessness, call **020 8937 2000**. If you are a private tenant, and you are being threatened with eviction, call **0207874 8414**.
- * **Person at Risk:** If you have any concerns about a person being harmed or at risk of abuse, call the Safeguarding Adults Team on **020 8937 4098**.
