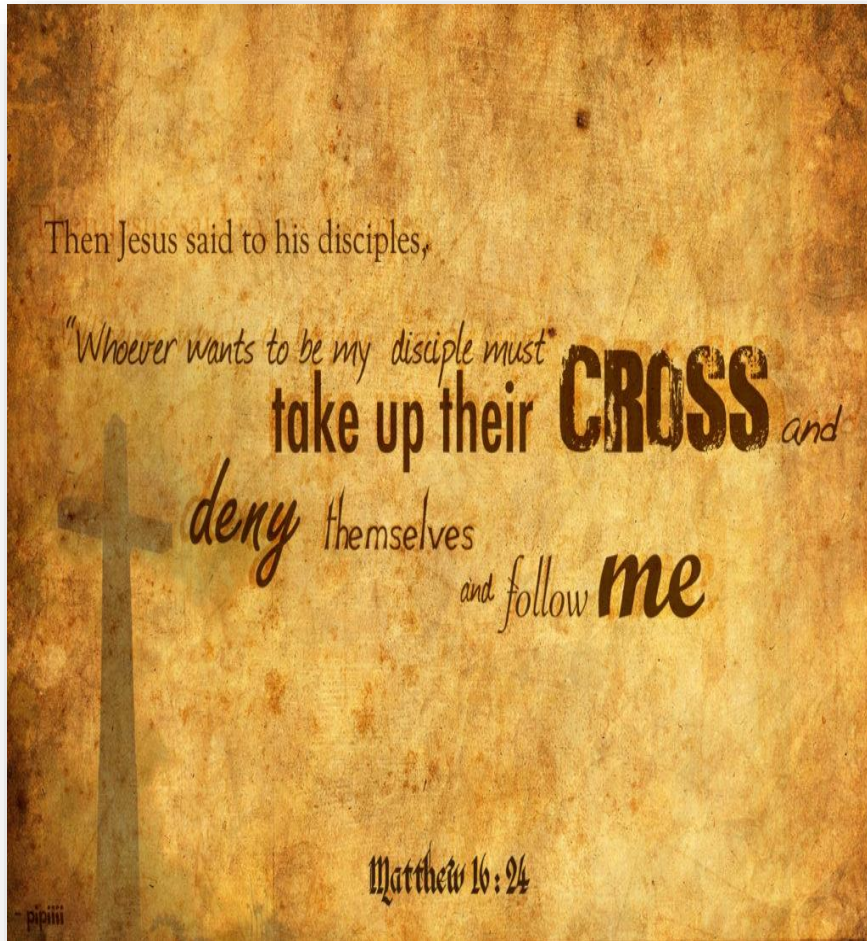

HELPING OTHERS TO ATTEND: If you can come to Mass on weekdays, please be generous and refrain from coming to Sunday Mass so that those who are busy during the week can attend Mass too, as there is no obligation to attend Mass at present.

PLANNED GIVING ENVELOPES: It is intended that, as many as possible, of the new Planned Giving boxes of envelopes for 2020-2021 for parishioners who have received and have used them previously or have requested them during 2019/20 will be delivered to the addresses we have registered for you. Boxes unable to be delivered will be returned to the church and arrangements to be announced later will be made for these to be collected by owners.
