THE GOD WHO SPEAKS - YEAR OF THE WORD 2020 - SUNDAY MEDITATIONS, 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Meditate: This is the third parable in which the vineyard is mentioned. As the first reading reveals we are the vineyard of the Lord. He puts us in charge of his vineyard, that is, sends us to look after the community for the good of all. We, like the people of the parable, want to give up the tenancy and become the owners at any cost, even damaging those who are above us.

Act: Consider the way you treat those who are above you at work or at home. You might consider a change of attitude or amendment of your behaviour.
