Friday 8th March – dedicated time for prayer for peace in the Holy Land

"I write, first, to thank you most sincerely for the generosity with which you and your parishioners responded to my request for a collection to assist with the relief of suffering in Gaza and the West Bank. We have been able to send over £31,000 to the Latin Patriarchate. This will make a real difference to people living in such desperate circumstances.

As we are all aware, the situation in the Holy Land has not improved since I last wrote, with failed negotiations, increasing humanitarian distress and a rising death toll. As Lent begins, I would like to urge that we continue our efforts, not least in prayer. And so I ask that, on Friday 8 March, there is a special focus of prayer for the Holy Land across the diocese.

I hope that your Lenten journey this year will be a fruitful one. Those three pillars of observance-prayer, fasting and almsgiving-are so helpful, and I pray that you will find a way to make use of each of them, in whatever way or form, in the weeks ahead."
