BAPTISM OF THE LORD

10TH JANUARY 2021

THEME: You Are My Beloved Son.



When Jesus asked John the Baptist to baptise him in the Jordan, just as John had baptised other people, Jesus saw that his task was to save people from their sins. He himself was without sin, but made himself one with the people in their weakness. And then God confirmed him in his task by saying: "This is my beloved Son." When we were baptised, we expressed, through our parents and godparents, that we had become one with Jesus. Since that day we share with Jesus in his task of serving and saving people. If we do so, then God can tell us too: "you are my beloved son or daughter."

YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH

With the Apostolic Letter "Patris Corde" ["With a Father's Heart"], Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of St. Joseph as patron of the Universal Church by Pope Pius IX on December 8th 1870. MASKS

*As we all know masks are compulsory in Church. This is even more important at present as the Virus is very high in London [1 in 30]. Please keep your masks on whilst in Church ensuring both your mouth and nose are covered. Do **NOT** remove it to speak to others. The Government has asked all those who are vulnerable to remain indoors. If you are unable to wear a mask due to a Health Condition, we kindly ask you to join us via live-stream. This is for the protection of all.*

GLOVES

We do not allow gloves to be worn inside the Church. Hands should be sanitized on entry, and again on exit. Understandably in this cold weather people are wearing woolen gloves. Please do not put them on until you have sanitized your hands on exiting. *Please be assured that, if you want to light candles, the candle lighters are sanitized with a 4hour barrier sanitiser so are quite safe to use.*

CHILDREN

You are welcome to bring children as long as they are old enough to remain seated with you in the pew. There is currently no crying room, baby changing facility, or toilets available.
