THEME: There Must Be Time To Heal



We all wish to see a world without evil, a Church without faults. To see that the real Church and the real world are not sinless and not perfect makes us impatient. Jesus reminds us: be patient, for God is patient with the Church and with the world, and also with us. Let us not forget this. He gives us the time to change. Let us ask Jesus this week that we may begin the change of the world and of the Church with the change of ourselves.

WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS 2023


