THEME: It is Risky to Follow the Lord



Do we have to seek suffering and death? Not at all! Jesus himself gives us the answer. He begged his Father to take suffering away from him. Yet he accepted death and the cross. Why? Because he loved the Father and he loved the people and wanted to save them. If he did that work and proclaimed his message, the religious leaders would turn against him and seek his death, to get rid of the nuisance he was. Yet he remained faithful to his mission, faithful until death. He

is now asking us to remain faithful even at the cost of suffering and death.

MEDITATE: This is one of those times when Jesus is giving us a "secret" to the kingdom of God.

<u>ACT</u>: What does taking up the cross mean in my life? In what concrete way does this gospel invite me to carry the cross?


