CHRIST THE KING, YEAR A

26TH NOVEMBER, 2023

THEME: Have You Met Me In The Poor?

The Church year ends with the celebration of Christ the King, and next Sunday the Church's new year starts with Advent. Matthew presents to us the scene of Christ our Lord coming as King in judgement. This scene 🛐 is the counterpart of the beatitudes, where the poor and the suffering were called blessed. At the judgement the Lord will ask us: "What have

you done for the poor and those who weep?" Jesus shows himself here not only as close to the poor and the humble, but he is himself the gentle, the sick, the persecuted. He asks us: "Have you met me in them?" What do we answer him?

MEDITATE: Separating sheep from goats was a familiar routine for the shepherds in Jesus' day.

ACT: Spend a few minutes each night in prayerful gratitude for those who have shown kindness to you.

ADVENT 2023 – JOURNEYING TO THE CRIB

The season of Advent is a time of preparation for the birth of Our Saviour. Listed below are activities and devotions to help us prepare for the coming feast of Christmas and its true meaning. This Liturgical year we will be recalling the mystery of Jesus our Saviour through the listening to the gospel of Mark - Year B.

THE ADVENT WREATH



The Advent Wreath [this can be a simple drawing to colour in, or something more elaborate], consisting of a circle of evergreens, symbolising the eternal nature of God and the continuing and everlasting life that comes from God through Christ. The four candles [3 purple symbolising repentance - and 1 pink -3^{rd} week, reminds us that we

are drawing nearer to Christmas Day], mark the four weeks of Advent, and attest to the truth of Jesus as the Light of the World [John 3. 17-21]. The "Prayer of Blessing" is available at the back of the Church.

THE JESSE TREE

The name Jesse Tree comes from a Bible passage describing the descent of the Messiah from Jesse in Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot will come out of the stock Jesse, and a branch out of his roots will bear fruit." The Gospels in Luke 3:23-38 and in Matthew 1:1-17 have genealogies of Jesus Christ.

The symbols show some important figures and events from Creation to the birth of Jesus Christ. This year it would be nice if we could make our own version of a Jesse Tree.
