FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT, YEAR B

THEME: Repent and Believe the Good News

As we begin Lent, the urgent message addressed to us today is: "Repent! Have a change of heart, be converted!" But who likes to change one's habits, one's mentality, one's lifestyle? We'd rather be left alone and go our old ways. Even Jesus was driven by the Spirit to the desert to be tempted there, to see with clear eyes who he was and what was his task and how people and events would try to turn him away from his mission. But Jesus was stronger

than temptation and sin. May his Spirit convert us to be what we are called to be and to do what we have to do as Christians. May he help us to overcome our temptations and make us stronger than sin.

<u>MEDITATE</u>: As Lent begins, the whole Church begins a period of spiritual renewal leading to Easter.

<u>ACT</u>: Make a list of spiritual priorities for this season, and keep it somewhere you will see it often. Ask yourself at the end of each day: "Have my actions reflected these priorities?"
