Celebration of Public Masses

There is restricted capacity of 100/120 in our building. Benches have been marked to fulfill the 1 metre + rule and the wearing of face coverings, except at Holy Communion, must be observed.

Children under 11 do not need to wear masks or keep 1 metre distance.

Fr John Miller RIP Fr John died this last week at the great age of 98 having been a priest for 67 years. In his retirement Fr John lived in a flat in Highlands, Oakleigh Park North, just opposite our school. While there, he had helped supply at St Mary Magdalen's from time to time, and was also a frequent customer at Costa coffee on his mobility machine.

Mass Intentions

Although the obligation has been temporarily suspended, all those outside those vulnerable categories are encouraged to attend Sunday Mass as practicing Catholics.

All must sanitise their hands on entry and keep the 1 metre + rule. Families may sit more closely.

After Communion leave by the two exit doors – but do not leave until you have consumed the Sacred Host.

The steward at each door will also have a basket for any offering donations.

The priest will not be greeting people as they leave. Any urgent business must be dealt with in the Sacristy after Mass.

Sunday Evening Bingo Since March and the beginning of social restrictions, this event had been suspended. Recently, the numbers had also dwindled and a decision has been made by Sean and Kitty Carey that any prospect of resuming it is not realistic. The amount in the Bingo fund - £240 has been handed to the parish to be applied to a worthwhile cause. Much thanks go to Sean and Kitty for running the Bingo for so many years and I am sure that at some point future events their expertise in running this will be put to good use again.

Chipping Barnet Food Bank

As winter approaches and the effects of coronavirus continue to trap people in financial crisis, we have decided to lend our support to the Trussell Trust's Chipping Barnet Food Bank in Somerset Road.

After each weekend mass, there will be a yellow tub in the porch where donations of non-perishable food can be left. Donations will be taken to the Food Bank on a weekly basis.

Suggested food donations: Tinned meat, fish, vegetables, potatoes, pulses, rice pudding, custard, pasta sauces, biscuits, cereal, sugar, coffee, long-life milk/fruit juice, jam/spreads, cooking oil, washing up liquid and toiletries. At the moment, they have plenty of baked beans, pasta and rice, tomatoes, soup and tea.
