Masses at 6pm Saturday and 11am Sunday will be conducted under the restrictions and procedure in place before this second lockdown. Masks must be worn, social distancing observed and if possible places booked for the weekend Masses by logging on to:

We have worked hard to ensure that our church is a safe environment and thank all those involved in fulfilling that. The new directives do allow public worship to continue. The Bishops however advise that in the interests of people's safety, including your priest who is in the 'over 70' category, it has been necessary to reduce the number of public Masses.

In the light of this, the church will be closed and daily Mass at 9.30am will be live streamed.

Communal public worship at Mass will continue at **6PM SATURDAY** and **11AM SUNDAY**.

The Bishops reiterate that the removal of the Sunday obligation means that nobody should feel guilty if they do not attend Mass, and urge all to pray at home for the end of the spread of the virus.

LENT 2021

Begins with Ash Wednesday on February 17th. If, before then, you can bring to the church last year's Palms/Crosses, there will be a basket in the porch.

Ash Wednesday

There will be public Mass and Imposition of Ashes at 9.30am. The Congregation of Rites has adapted the Rite of Distribution of Ashes in view of the Pandemic. Ash will not be marked as a cross on each forehead but sprinkled over the head of each person. This will happen after the reception of Holy Communion as each person leaves the church.

Ash Wednesday at Home

The Archbishop has recommended that this year it may be best to celebrate the beginning of Lent with a Liturgy at home, especially for families with children. He reminds us that receiving ash on our heads is an outward sign of the more important inner movement of the heart to change "repent" and move closer to Jesus.

He suggests to gather at home for a time of prayer in the following way:

1. Gather and make the Sign of the Cross – "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit".
2. Read the Gospel for today - St Matthew's Gospel, 6 v 1-6 and 16-18.
3. Say the following prayer:-

Lord, God, with all our hearts we ask you, have mercy on your people and strengthen them at this time.
Without you we are so weak and need your strength. Save your people, O Lord.

Comfort those who are sick and those who mourn. Give eternal life in Your Kingdom to those who have died.
In these days of Lent may we keep closer to You, who died and rose to life, and live and reign for ever and ever.
Amen.

4. Make the Sign of the Cross on each other's forehead, saying either:-
"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" or
"Repent and believe in the Gospel".
5. Pray together the Our Father; the Hail Mary, add prayers for others.
6. Conclude with the 'Glory be to the Father...' and the Sign of the Cross.

Lent

Meanwhile, from the first Sunday of Lent for those who attend the public Masses the booklet which was produced two years ago based on our Stations of the Cross will be available (free or donation) for anyone to take home to pray the devotion.

Children's Liturgy – a note for parents of young children Due to the current situation, it has not been possible to celebrate Children's Liturgy at Sunday Masses for a long time and whilst we have the option to watch the live streaming, young children may be missing out on the participation. We are pleased to say that Children's Liturgy will be posted on our YouTube channel and on the new parish Facebook page in the form of a pre-recorded video every weekend. It is a pilot scheme, but please do publicise it and give feedback if needs be.
