We have worked hard to ensure that our church is a safe environment and thank all those involved in fulfilling that.

Developments from 17th May

The church is now open for private prayer each day from 9am until 7pm. No stewards are needed but all should continue to use hand sanitizer and face mask. The Holy Water stoups cannot yet be used. Congregational singing is still suspended. Images can be touched but not kissed. Stewards and booking online will continue at weekend Masses to supervise capacity, which remains at its limited level.

There are QR codes to be scanned on arrival but please do continue to pre-book your preferred Mass attendance as we are required to retain the track and trace process and we will also continue to manage the maximum capacity allowed under the current Government Guidelines.

The Parish continues to operate a 1m + social distancing format but bubbles and families are more than welcome to continue to sit together.

Holy Communion will continue to be given only under the form of bread, but the dialogue between ministers and communicants – "The Body of Christ" – "Amen", is restored.

Those who wish to receive Communion on the tongue may do so, but should wait to receive towards the end of Communion and from the priest alone.

The Offertory Collection can be placed in baskets in the porch before Mass or as you leave after Communion.

Sunday June 6th – Corpus Christi

At the 11am Mass that Sunday Bishop Sherrington will celebrate Mass and administer the Sacrament of Confirmation on over 20 candidates

Clearly under present capacity restrictions that will put pressure on numbers at that 11am Mass. We are hoping, however, to relay the Mass onto the screen in the Hall as an overflow space. Holy Communion will be distributed there to those present. However social distancing will need to be observed in the hall and maximum capacity adhered to. Please, if you are able, consider attending Mass on that weekend either at 6pm Saturday or 9am Sunday.

Also, due to the Pandemic, we will again be unable to have a Corpus Christ procession on that day this year.
