Lord,

As rational creatures, we, humans, have been created with a capacity and yearning to understand, to learn, and to live lives which flow from what is true, what is wise. A friend, last week, was sharing with me how she was amazed by a large monkey which had learnt to touch the screen of a mobile phone to change the image; this creature has learnt to do

this by copying humans. It made me think less of the ability of the monkey and more on our capacities. The distance, the un-crossable bridge, between a monkey and a human being is immense. In fact, it is not a difference in degree at all, but a difference of essence: the monkey does not have a rational soul; the monkey is not made in the image and likeness of God. The monkey cannot choose to seek truth, cannot choose to serve, cannot choose to live a life which is inspired by eternal beauty, cannot worship. Do we really see how profoundly different we are to all creation? Do we grasp a little of, for Whom we are made?

This Sunday is Sunday of the Word of God. Pope Francis instituted this special focus on the Word of God, the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, in 2019, on the 1600th anniversary of the death of the most eminent of all Biblical scholars, Saint Jerome (c.342-420), who wrote, "ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ". As God created humankind to be intelligent and to learn, God has given us the Holy Bible, the Word of God, which contains such writings, such historical references, such teachings as to fill our minds and hearts with the actual necessary human words which can lead the humble person to salvation, the goal of every word in the Holy Bible being Jesus Christ.

The Holy Father, referring to Dei Verbum from the Second Vatican Council, and to Pope Benedict XVI's Verbum Domini, reminds us that all Scripture is inspired, that the Holy Spirit, Who inspired the sacred authors, is at work in the humble human soul as he or she reads the words of salvation. Pope Francis refers us to the Road to Emmaus, from Saint Luke's Gospel (24:13-35), where we see Jesus explaining to the disciples, whose hope in Jesus the Messiah had deeply waned, that the Scriptures point to Him. This is truly brought to glorious perfection when they realise at supper, at the breaking of bread, that Jesus was with them. Yes, the Word of God, the Scriptures, the Holy Bible, is the living Word which (Who) leads us to the Person of Jesus, in His holy Flesh and Blood.

The question then poses itself to us: as rational creatures, creatures made to know, love, and follow Truth, do we choose to read, do we choose to be moulded by, do we choose to be inflamed by the sacred words of salvation? In an age, where we are literally surrounded by human words and human opinions, as if they are the ultimate word, let us remember the words of the Apostle Paul, to whom Pope Francis refers, "all scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness". As creatures, deemed worthy of the sublime and beautiful Saviour, Jesus Christ, let us rediscover our profound need and longing for the sacred Scriptures, for the Word of God. May the Word be God be ever more deeply revered in our families.

Thank you for your donations to the Cardinal's Holy Land appeal which raised £539.42.

The Cardinal has asked each parish to hold a second collection next weekend and writes "The Parish Priest of the Church of the Holy Family in Gaza City and the CEO of the Latin Patriarchate say the situation they face is grave and most demanding. We were told that there are still 600 people sheltering and being cared for in the parish compound, together with over 50 seriously disabled and vulnerable children. Water and food can be bought in the local markets at much inflated prices. With the damage inflicted on this site some time ago now, cooking hot meals is only possible three times a week. The parish is also providing for 200 people in the Orthodox property as well as for local Muslim neighbours.

The Westminster Cathedral Choir School has chorister opportunities for boys with musical potential in Years 2, 3 or 4.

Every September, WCCS welcomes up to 6 choristers into Year 4 or 5. Becoming a chorister at Westminster Cathedral offers boys the opportunity to sing both here in central London, and on tour internationally, in one of the world's great choirs.
