In the Psalm for the Epiphany we read, "the kings of Tarshish and the sea coasts shall pay him tribute. The kings of Sheba and Seba shall bring him gifts. Before him all kings shall fall prostrate, all nations shall serve him". These place names signified far off and exotic places, places which did not profess the Jewish faith, but it is, still, to the Lord, to the King of Israel, that all nations and all kings shall pay homage. In Isaiah, too, we read of distant nations, nations who were not of Israel, coming to pay homage, coming to give to the Lord the very best they have.

As we hear loud and clear during this Christmas Season, the Word was made flesh (Jn 1:14). This Word, Jesus Christ, is the Word through Whom all creation comes into existence from nothing, and, furthermore, is sustained in existence (Heb 1:3). In short, every cell, every atom, every created thing, everything that can change, is held in life by the Word, by Jesus. That is the Christian claim and there vast armoury support this claim, freely choosing the Light, Who is calling each of us.

Any man or woman who sincerely yearns for what is actually always true; any person who is radically open to the mystery and majesty of life, which transcends and heals any tragedy and also escorts every human success into its true perspective; any man or woman who is so, is responding to the Way, the Truth and the Life, Who is Jesus. There is no other. In the Gospel we learn of the wise men, who though not Jewish, were looking for the Truth, were studying the constellations, were reading in the Word's creation signs which were pointing to the Crib, pointing to the Baby Jesus. All creation, for those who will listen, points to, sings of Jesus, the Lord. How will we then respond? The gift is given.

The wise men are not the same after their encounter with the Baby Jesus. Before meeting Him they are prepared to offer their very best, this sings movingly of their hearts' dispositions. Following their adoration of the Baby Jesus, their lives take a new route. They will not be led off course by a wicked wolf in sheep's clothing, Herod. This Epiphany, may we, whatever age, come to know Who Jesus is. May we follow the Way, which is His Way. May we see in the beauty of creation the Word's majesty and sublime attention to detail. May we resolve to offer our very best, which is a life, after Mary's example, which seeks to magnify the Lord in all things. Poor as we are, let us offer Him our hearts, our minds, our bodies, our souls; for He can, and does, and will, glorify us.

Thank you to all who helped with the preparation, donations and serving at the Afternoon Tea on Friday 29th December. It was a relaxing afternoon, blessed with a good turn out, and particularly heartening to see so many of the Confirmation Candidates, whose presence made this Christmas gathering a time of fellowship for all generations. We were also gladdened to see Fr Gladstone at the Mass before the Tea.
