Last week the readings led us to consider the historical fact of the Original Sin. Before this Sin, our sinless first parents, Adam and Eve, lived in sublime harmony with the Lord, between each other, and with all creation. Adam and Eve enjoyed specially given graces by the Lord, which were above nature, they were supernatural, these gifts gave them immortality and a fundamental integrity within their entire person. From the moment Eve listened and gave credence to the serpent, and was not helped by her husband, Adam, to ward off the attack, for he was by her side (Gen 3:6), the subsequent history of our one human family has known suffering and death, the effects of sin.

The Original Sin caused all who share in human nature to lose the original supernatural gift of immortality, we can call this a privation of grace; the wound of the Sin made it harder for human nature to pursue virtue consistently; and it also affected the reason's pursuit of what is true. Human nature is still essentially good but it is wounded and this wound cannot be healed by us. It is a very deep reality. Depending on our self-awareness, it is possible to recognise within ourselves an inclination to do what is not good. Saint Paul speaks so eloquently of this in Romans, (Rm 7:13-20), and Saint Augustine in his Confessions, Bk 1, ch 6 & 7, speaks of the natural inclination of 'innocent' children, who, nevertheless, exhibit signs of this wound of nature. Naturally, we can follow many paths of self-help, we can treat symptoms, but still the spiritual wound perjures. This deep sin requires, demands a deep saving act.

Enter the Son of the Most High. Enter His Cross, upon which He took away the guilt and punishment due to sin, all sin. When Jesus defeats the snively serpent Satan in the wilderness, by not succumbing to temptation, the Original Sin is being atoned for; ultimately Jesus' suffering and sacrifice upon the Cross is the perfect and eternal sin offering, with power such as we can only stand with mouths agape. Every Sacrament receives its power from the Light of the risen Saviour, every Sacrament. This Light, this grace, has the power to heal so deeply within our souls that we begin to be made fit for heaven. To even write these words is beyond joy.

Men and women, through the centuries, have devoted their lives to be remade in the alorious Light of Jesus, through lives of prayer, service, and moral beauty. They have seen, they have heard, they have understood that Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. This Sunday the readings teach us how we need to have our faith tested and purified – we read of Abraham and Isaac. who are prepared, in deep faith, to obey the Lord, regardless of cost; and also how the Lord will give us deep spiritual consolation to follow Him at all times -

we hear of the ravishing beauty of the Transfiguration. Christianity teaches that each of us is called to be remade in grace, won and freed for us by Jesus upon the Cross. Our faith needs to be tested and purified so that we can gradually learn how precious Jesus is, and live lives focused on true priorities and humble gratitude. Lent is the time to enter this path.
