Our first reading from 2 Chronicles is the last book of the whole Bible in the Jewish tradition. In this short extract we are given a succinct summation of salvation history: how the Lord gives, offering a mutual loving bond, how His people then turn from the Lord, breaking their freely made promises, and how the Lord will, after chastisements after correction, offer yet another covenant, another way forward. In our reading we learn how the Lord sent messenger after

messenger, and that Israel's response was to ridicule, despise, and laugh at His prophets, until their infidelity warranted the destruction of the Temple of Jerusalem.

Now for the Jewish man or woman the Temple of Jerusalem can be summed up in those words from Psalm 48, "Mount Zion, true pole of the earth, the Great King's city!" (Ps 48:3). Other translations render it as: "His holy mountain, beautiful in elevation, is the joy of all the earth, Mount Zion, in the far north, the city of the great king" (Ps 48:1-2). Zion is another name for Jerusalem, referring to one of the hills which comprises Jerusalem, rather like Mount Moriah, where Abraham would be tested in the virtue of faith by the Lord, by the suggestion that he sacrifices his son, his only son, Isaac. Jerusalem, at the heart of which is the Temple, is thus the religious, the cultural, the political centre of the universe. For the Lord of all creation, Who is Himself outside of all time and space, to dwell amongst His people was a treasure for which no word, no price can ever be adequate.

The behaviour of the Lord's chosen people, so unfaithful, so ungrateful, so arrogant, necessitated the Lord departing from His Temple (Ezekiel 10:18) and permitting it to be burned, demolished, and destroyed (2 Chr 36:19). His people were led into exile. A time of soul searching, a time of honest reflection on how they betrayed the Lord. And as the Jewish Bible ends, we read how the Lord God led and inspired a pagan king, Cyrus of Persia, to rebuild the Temple in Jerusalem, to invite the exiled Jews to return to offer worship to God.

The Lord of Hosts always opens a path. It is His gift, His Way, His light which saves. Holy Scripture in the Bible, the Old Testament which we share with the Jewish people, promises the Son, a child born for you, Who will be the eternal Father, Who will suffer and die for the sins of many. God Who gives has given Himself; the definitive Prophet, Priest, and King. The Light, which was spoken into creation (Gen 1:3), before the creation of the sun, moon, and stars (Gen 1:14-19), has been born. Light which cannot but purify and save when we freely turn back to Him. This Light dwells in His Tabernacles in the Catholic Church. The true pole of the earth is amongst us. Let us not be disorderly attached to whatever holds us back, whatever gives us what we want, when and how we want it. Jesus is leading us to eternal pastures, that is the purpose and journey of life. Live the eternal vision. We only truly are in Christ.
