Please lead from the **front** when coming to receive the Eucharist.

It may take a little time for us all to remember this change. So, please stay seated if there is a queue forming and you find it difficult to stand for periods.

Near to the seminary, where I received seven years of formation, there is a church called Santi Biagio e Carlo ai Catinari. In English it means Saints Blaise and Charles, the ai Catinari refers to the many carpenters who, specialising in wooden bowls, lived in that area during its construction in the sixteenth century. Above the green door of the main entrance there is a well-weathered blueish oval painting on stone of Saint Charles Borromeo, San Carlo, with his hands clasped together, his head slightly tilted back, and his eyes gazing into the purifying mercy and love of God. Above this painting - which consoled, challenged, and taught me over many years - one reads the single word, painted in black paint, as fresh as the Day is young, humilitas (humility). This word is surmounted by a sculptured stone crown which protrudes from the façade of the church. In all the bustle, heat, and distractions of Rome, San Carlo had chosen the better part and it was not to be taken away from him (cf. Lk 10:42). That one word, humility, was Saint Charles' motto as a Bishop, it is, also, a towering theme through Holy Week, which we have now entered.

Fulfilling the prophecy from Zechariah, "Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on an ass, on a colt the foal of an ass", Jesus enters Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. Yes a colt is a humble animal, for this was no military manoeuvre exhibiting majestic horses, generals, and princes. The Prophet also says that the king is triumphant and victorious; these two accolades are not to be grasped in merely worldly terms. The humility of Jesus is our key to peace.

On Palm Sunday, Saint Paul to the Philippians – this reading has also, unsurprisingly, been set to utterly sublime chant: Christus factus est, https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=XBpcA5g6YVs this performance is sung by monks from Brazil – explains that the God the Son, equal to the Father, did not spare Himself the condition of assuming our human nature – with all its limitations – and then accepting death, death on a cross for us. This is where the complete triumph and victory lie, as mentioned by Zechariah. On Maundy Thursday, Jesus will wash His disciples' feet. Again, this is a humble act, normally assigned to a household slave, but the Greek text reveals that when Jesus lays down His outer garments, and then when He picks them up afterwards, the verbs in question are the same verbs used to describe His laying down His life on the Cross, and then His picking it up again at the Resurrection. That the eternal Son of God, in eternal communion with the eternal Father and Spirit, would delight to die for us, sings of the humility of God to offer us salvation. Are we ready yet to live this with gratitude?

Saint Mary Magdalen appears frequently in the readings this week. On Palm Sunday, a long and venerable tradition teaches that it was she who anointed the Sacred Head of our Lord at Bethany; on Good Friday, she is standing with Our Blessed Lady, Mary, at the Cross; on Holy Saturday, she takes spices, with other women to anoint, what she thinks will be, a dead body; and on Easter Sunday she sees the empty tomb and runs to tell Saint Peter. Saint Mary Magdalen was a woman whose former ways and life were shattered by the humility of Jesus. That God would come to suffer, die, and rise to offer eternal love for each of us, became, and rightly so, the complete focus and goal of her earthly sojourn. O, the humility of God, the humility of Jesus Christ. We all need to have our ways, our thoughts, our hearts, our minds, shattered by the humility of the Lord, Who will show us His way this week, this Holy Week. His love is the only way to life.
