On two past Mondays, during February, different people from our family have met to listen, pray, reflect, and share their thoughts on how they personally can contribute to our mission at Saint Mary Magdalen's. And this is at the heart of synodality: how each of us can contribute to our shared mission. The roots, the etymology, of the word synod are: 'syn' which means with and together; and 'hodos' which means a way, or journey. We can understand a synod as a meeting of those who are present journeying, pilgrimaging, together, with each other.

Our two synodal conversations, as encouraged by our Bishops, took place as part of the Church Universal but also as a living encounter between members of the Body of Christ in Whetstone. One of the particular aspects of a synodal conversation is that it is an actual gathering of people at a particular time in response to specific questions; gatherings at which a humble prayer to the Holy Spirit is said. At the heart of the prayer we find: "teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right". We see that a synodal conversation is not asking for responses to questions placed in a newsletter, neither is it an opportunity for someone to merely say 'their own thing', heaven forbid.

The two central strands of thought mentioned by the Bishops were co-responsibility and formation. Co-responsibility awakens each of us to the unique chrism, gift of the Holy Spirit, that we have received by the Sacrament of Baptism and how we must live that out in and for the Church. All the Baptised are co-responsible for the Body of Christ, the Church. All the baptised are co-responsible for the saving mission of the Son of God, Who came to suffer and die, for our sins, and then rise to justify our eternal salvation. And regarding formation, the formation of each and every Christian is fundamentally our own responsibility. As each one of us has been gifted with a rational soul, we are truly creatures who need to understand our Faith; also, the amount of formation which has been and is offered, taking into account future plans, too, in our parish is a testament to the joy and purpose that we attach to formation here. We can never stand still. Please do be proactive in your formation. Some of our parishioners recently mentioned to me how they are reading through Genesis and the Catechism of the Catholic Church. How excellent!

Last Sunday, at the Transfiguration, Jesus was talking with Moses and Elijah, who represent the Law and the Prophets. This Sunday our first reading is the Ten Commandments, moral teaching which is applicable in all ages to every human and the foundation of the Law. It is only in the risen Body of Jesus Christ, in Whom we are members through the costly gift of His Holy Spirit, that we are able to truly rejoice and follow the Ten Commandments both internally and externally. The mission of Jesus to be lived out in Whetstone demands members of His Body, the Church, to be truly co-responsible and hungry for formation.
