It may take a little time for us all to remember this change. So, please stay seated if there is a queue forming and you find it difficult to stand for periods.

As I look out of the windows of the presbytery, front, back, and side, I cannot but fail to be taken aback by the relentless fecundity of nature, by the sheer variety of


plants, flowers, and 'weeds', all growing in size, strength, and colour. The ivy, that tenacious and life-sucking vine, growing on the front garden trees was particularly well established, but after having thoroughly cut the vines at the base of the trees, it was so heartening to see how quickly the trees responded and blossomed with elegant beauty. All sorts grow in a garden - pruning is necessary.

In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks of His Father as the vinedresser. We read of pruning, bearing fruit, and of some branches being collected and thrown on the fire; the vinedresser certainly has His work to do. Jesus is the vine and His Father is the vinedresser. Therefore, for us to be made holy, for us to be fashioned anew for heaven we have to make our homes in Jesus, and He in us; we have to remain in Him, and He in us, in order that the Father, the vinedresser, can recreate us. Let's look at that again, it is the Father Who is so deeply involved with our necessary sanctification and the eternal Father can only do that in and through His Jesus. Why is that? For Jesus is forgiveness incarnate, He is reconciliation, Jesus is salvation in our flesh, Jesus is heaven on earth. At the end of the Gospel reading Jesus says, "it is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit, and then you will be my disciples" (Jn 8).

Jesus is the Way to the Father, the way to eternal life for He is both totally divine and fully human - heaven and creation meet in Him. When He says "I am", and Jesus says these with regards to seven objects in Saint John's Gospel, He is, each time, calling us to remember the utterly holy and eternal 'name' of the LORD given to Moses in Exodus (3:14), "I AM WHO I AM". Jesus is not a way, He is the Way. All humanity has been brought into existence through the Word – Jesus is the Word incarnate. Regarding other religions and other ways to God the Church solemnly teaches, "The Catholic Church rejects nothing that is true and holy in these religions. She regards with sincere reverence those ways of conduct and of life, those precepts and teachings which, though differing in many aspects from the ones she holds and sets forth, nonetheless often reflect a ray of that Truth which enlightens all men. Indeed, she proclaims, and ever must proclaim Christ "the way, the truth, and the life" (Jn 14:6), in whom men may find the fullness of religious life, in whom God has reconciled all things to Himself" (Nostra Aetate 2). Jesus is the Way, Jesus is God.

When we answer the invitation of the Holy Spirit, we necessarily approach Jesus in humility and in the unchanging truth that apart from Him, cut off from Him, we can do nothing true. It is only in the Son, that the Father can hold each of us – his precious sons or daughters, bought by the precious Blood of His Son. It is only when we are a part of the vine that the vinedresser can prune us, can love us, teach us, strengthen us to give Him glory after the manner of His only Son, Who has commanded us to love one another as He has loved us. As gardens need pruning, let us not shy away from how the Father needs to prune His sons and daughters in Christ.


