The Resurrection of Jesus is not merely the historical event of a man being raised from the dead.

Lunchtime party for Senior Citizens this Sunday, 7th April will take place from 1.00pm (after the 11.00am Mass) in the Hall.


We know from the Gospels that Jesus brought three people back from the dead to life: the widow of Nain's son, Jairus' daughter, and Lazarus. Also we know that this fact alone, particularly with regards to Lazarus, was leading many to believe in Jesus rather than following the authority of the chief priests, "so the chief priests planned to put Lazarus also to death, because on account of him many of the Jews were going away and believing in Jesus" (Jn 12:9-11). Jesus also encourages those who doubt His divinity to take notice of His works, "but if I do them, even though you do not believe me, believe the works, that you may know and understand that the Father is in me and I am in the Father" (Jn 10:38).

Jesus' miracles and His raising others from the dead were signs which challenge us to accept Who He says He is. Jesus also makes clear, from Saint Luke's Gospel, that there are those who will never believe even if a man should rise from the dead, consider the story of Abraham, the poor Lazarus, and the rich man, "but Abraham said, 'they have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them'. And he said, 'no, father Abraham; but if some one goes to them from the dead, they will repent'. He said to him, 'If they do not hear Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced if some one should rise from the dead'" (Lk 16:29-31). May each of us truly be open to the power of Jesus to effect such great miracles in His creation and in our lives. The name Lazarus in Hebrew means 'God has helped', both the Lazaruses were open to the power of God.

The Resurrection of Jesus, though, differs utterly in essence from the rising of these mortal humans from the dead. Jesus is always the sacrificial Lamb of God, Who takes away the sins of the world. Jesus is always a divine Person, the second Person of the Trinity, Who took on human flesh in history from the Virgin Mary. Always, Jesus is the Son of God, Whose divinity cannot die. He delivers His sublime humanity totally to be sacrificed as the true Passover Lamb. When the power of God raises this, the sweetest and most loving of all sacrifices, Jesus' humanity, from the dead, His humanity becomes Radiance, indeed He is truly the, "let there be light", from Genesis in Person, visible to the human eye. Saint Paul thus commands us to, "look for the things that are in heaven"; Saint Peter professes that we must accept that in Jesus alone are sins forgiven. And Jesus Himself, in the revelation of the Divine Mercy, next Sunday, confirms that in Him alone is the mercy which, when accepted, will open the gates of heaven. May our pride be conquered by the eternal Light risen today, and, like Lazarus, fully and irrevocably consent to being helped by God. HAPPY EASTER! HE IS RISEN! ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA!
